

Rainfall about average for the month – the first month of the year for which this has been the case. All others have been either well below or well above. Most of the rain fell in the last 8 days with the first three weeks giving us something of an Indian summer – from the point of view of precipitation if not temperature. For instance late September of last year gave us at least one day with 29 deg C. I don't think we got that this year.

Back to "normal" for the year with another well above average month of rainfall. And with this year being one for records, the seven months of this year from April through to the end of October have seen the highest total recorded for this period – some 33 inches as opposed to the next highest of 27 inches in 2000. But in that year we had a dry June and July with sunshine as well. So with our wet and dark summer this year it doesn't surprise me that vegetable and other crops are somewhat disappointing. And then if you ask the bees how they have fared this year it gets even worse with honey production down by as much as 70%. At least our lawns have stayed green. Oh well, there is also Christmas to look forward to and we have made up the annual rainfall deficit I was reporting last year.


