

Back to School

I used to hate those words as a child. No sooner had we broken up from school for the summer holidays than shops like Woolworth were announcing that it was time to go back. This benefice has a very special schools' ministry. There are four schools in our benefice and over 1000 children attend them.

Pimperne and Durweston Primary Schools are affiliated to the Church of England. As Rector, I am an ex officio foundation governor, and several of our church members work tirelessly in supporting the schools also as foundation governors. Much of my time is taken up not only with governor duties but in taking assemblies, occasional teaching, after school clubs etc.

We also have two independent schools: Bryanston and Knighton House. Bryanston has its own chaplain, Revd Andrew Haviland. and I assist in Knighton.

St Nicholas Church is used throughout the week by both Durweston Primary school and Knighton House. And the church is packed when the schools celebrate the major festivals. St Peter, Pimperne look forward to the building of a new primary school in the village. We pray regularly for the heads, staff, governors and pupils in all the schools.

Schools work is a major part of what we do. You can help by your prayers, attending school functions, or by volunteering to help as a governor or by offering to hear pupils read. If you would like further details please contact me for more information.



To make this badge you will need:-


- a piece of card about 9 cm x 9 cm (you can cut it off an empty cereal box)
