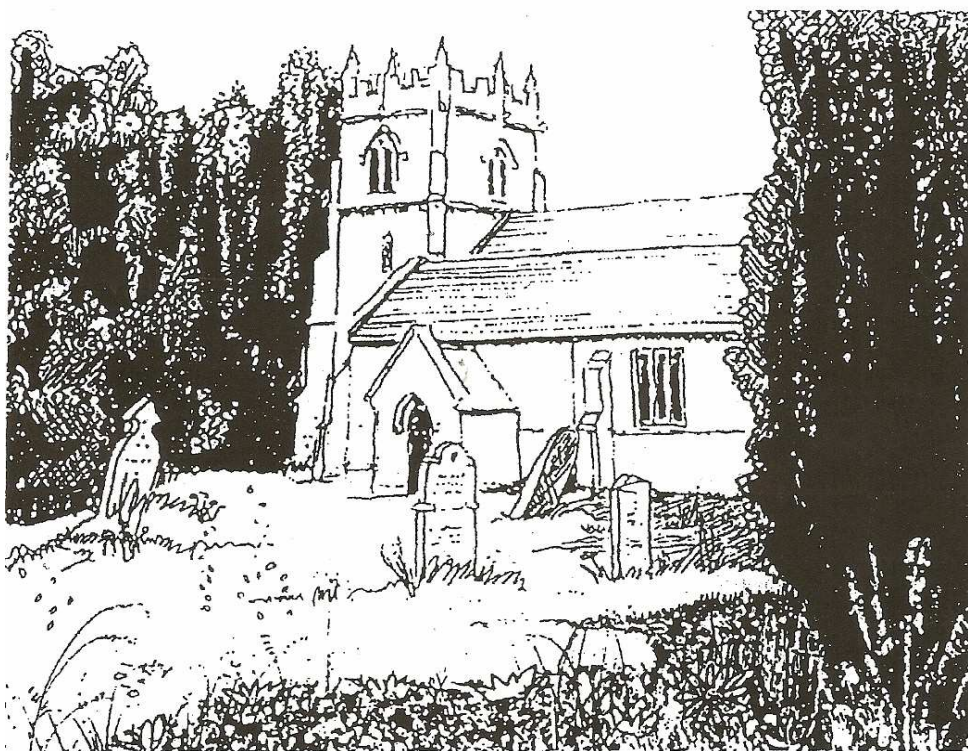

Recollection

The season of Autumn is a time of recollection. We remember God's goodness as we give thanks for the harvest; we remember the saints of old and those who gave their lives in the service of their country.

Recollection is at the heart of church life. Every week in the benefice at least one of our churches celebrates Holy Communion when we recall the love of God for us in His Son who died for us, who rose again and we wait with expectation for him to come again.

Historically, recollection formed part of an individual's spiritual life. This has been retained in the Christian Contemplative tradition. However it may be something from which we could all profit. We mark and recollect family events such as birthdays, marriages and anniversaries of death. How much more should we be mindful of Christ's love and presence with us each day?

The first stage of recollection is attentiveness to the voice of duty, to the law of God. We all know what is right and wrong, we just need to follow the right way. The second stage is recollection of the promptings of the Holy Spirit in our inner lives. This comes by practise and by listening to that inner voice. The third and final stage is recollection of the love of God. Thus perfect recollection consists in abiding in the love of our God. In the words of Jesus "*Abide in my love*".

This autumn may we grow in recollection, living at peace in the love that God has for us all.

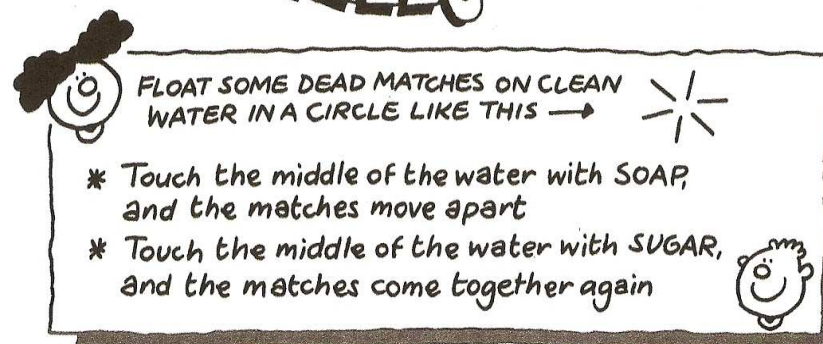

Following the trend since the end of March, this month gave us another below average monthfor rainfall. A 26 day period ending on 24 th July with a thunder storm was rainless apart from 1.4mm on 2 nd July. The rest of the month's rain fell in the last 8 days. Temperatures, on the other hand, were high 20s for the first 3 weeks. Much watering of veggie patches and borders all round. What a difference from last year!			
August	Highest	Lowest	Average
1.26 in(32.0 mm)	6.18 in(157 mm) 1997	0.42 in(10.7 mm) 1981	2.43 in(61.7 mm)
And so to August with another below average month. Two thirds of the rain fell in the first week leaving many rainfree days for the rest of the month. Watering has remained an important part of the routine for veggie patches even though temperatures are heading, gently, towards autumn. Fruit trees are showing the benefit of more normal pollination conditions in spring; it is great to have an apple crop again and for the first time we have a full pear tree.

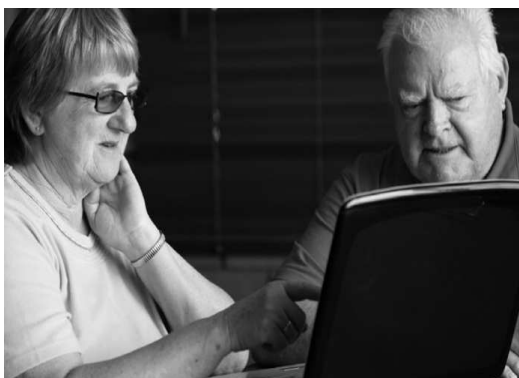
Free and confidential information service for the over 50's Anne Wilkins and Phyllis Watt are Wayfinders who provide this support to anyone over 50 in the

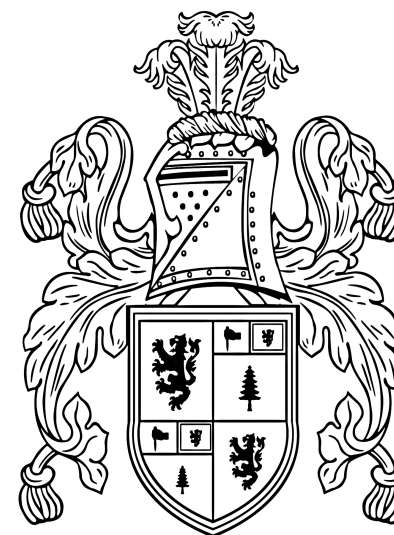
